Dr. Roger Bridges is a lifelong educator, *equity* practitioner and consultant, mental health/wellness professional, storyteller and former school administrator. Dr. Bridges is the founder and principal of Building Bridges, an equity-centered consulting practice dedicated to providing schools and organizations with support in the areas of belonging, institutional growth, equitable learning spaces and work environments. Most recently, Dr. Bridges served as the Assistant Head of School for Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Belonging at Windward School in LosAngeles. He also served as Associate Head of School for Advancement, Equity, Inclusion and Counseling at Echo Horizon School, a PK - 6 independent school in Culver City. Dr. Bridges has served as a facilitator and motivational speaker for schools and community-based organizations, including The Bill & Melinda Gates Leadership Institute (Atlanta, GA), PACT Adopt (The Bay Area, CA), Curtis School (Los Angeles), St. Lawrence of Brindisi School (Watts, CA), St. Mark's School of Altadena and St. Monica's Prep (Santa Monica, CA). Additionally, he has been the keynote speaker for The Buckley School's annual MLK Jr. Service Day.

Nationally, Dr. Bridges has been a featured workshop presenter on issues of equity and inclusion at the annual National Association of Independent Schools (NAIS) Conference as well as the annual NAIS-sponsored People of Color Conference (POCC). He is also the co-founder and co-director of the Empowerment and Engagement Coalition Conference for African American Youth (Greater Los Angeles Area). Roger has served on the board of directors of Timothy Murphy School, a non-public school, in San Rafael, CA., and the Marin Education Fund (now known as 10,000 Degrees), a scholarship and resource organization for individuals seeking post-secondary education and vocational training. He is a graduate of the San Rafael Chamber of Commerce Leadership Institute (Marin County, CA). Dr. Bridges served on the Marin Community Foundation's (MCF) Partnership Committee which provides awards and stipends to individuals and groups making a difference in their communities. Mr. Bridges earned his doctorate in educational leadership from the University of Southern California (Rossier School of Education).
